

#### **Important Information for Fall Contest Competitors**

Plans are underway for the Fall 2019 Dixie District International Chorus Prelims and Quartet Convention. This convention will be held October 4-5, 2019 in Ringgold, GA. The headquarters hotel will be the Hampton Inn located at 6875 Battlefield Pkwy, Ringgold, GA, 30736; (706) 935-4800. The contest venue is The Colonnade Center, 264 Catoosa Circle, Ringgold, which is about 6 minutes from the hotel.

**Deadline** for contestant entries is midnight, Friday, September 13, 2019. However, as of today (August 1) error messages may appear on the Barberscore website. So, I am asking that you **Please do not do ANY-THING in Barberscore just yet.** 

There is now a new target date of **August 10th** to have things fully ready for competitors. Again - <u>DO</u> NOT open your contest sessions in Barberscore until you get the "green light" from Jim Sams and/or receive an email message that Barberscore is up and running!

If desired, ALL Competitors may choose to facilitate and start sending "manual" contest entries via email to JIM SAMS to get ahead of things... that is totally up to you. You would only need to collect the basic info to include:

- Name of group
- For choruses: (estimated # on stage; director name)
- For quartets: names and voice parts of members; their BHS member #

Which awards/contests they wish to enter

<u>Do not even worry about listing songs (just yet). A reminder - once Barberscore is ready for competitors, you will still have plenty of time to get your new charts added to your repertory (as long as you do it within a few days of the contest). Any existing charts will still be in your repertory.</u>

Together we will get this done. Please get your new quartets registered NOW due to delays in Society processing times. Please also get your quartet renewals done now rather than later.

BE SURE that you have ONLY those men in your chapter who are "officially" signed up to enter your quartet or chorus for contest! If you have questions or need help, contact me ASAP. Again, you will also receive an email notifying you that the Dixie District Convention & Contests is officially open for contest entry.

\*\*IMPORTANT NOTE! \*\*\* Enter ALL your songs in your REPETOIRE list that you plan to sing OR MAY sing. If you are waiting for a new arrangement, enter it into the song list anyway and then if you don't have it cleared before contest, just don't sing it or remove prior to contest. It is worse IF you sing a song that is NOT in your REPETOIRE entry list. IF you fail to enter a song by contest time that you plan to sing, it cannot be entered late OR after the contest. For those of you who are not aware, a quartet cannot sing THE SAME song TWICE at any point in your quartet contest sessions. If a quartet song is sung by quartet members in a chorus contest, the song is legal to be sung once in quartet competition during the weekend.

For CHORUSES, we will have an International Chorus Prelim, Most Improved Chorus, and Plateau Awards presented. You may also sing songs FOR SCORE FOR EVALUATON ONLY if you so choose.

For QUARTETS, we will have a District Quartet Championship (2 round), a Seniors Quartet Champion, a Super Seniors Quartet Champion, a Seniors Quartet Prelim, a Novice Champion, and a Super Novice Champion awarded. We will also offer a Score for Evaluation ONLY session for those quartets who do not wish to compete but would like to receive your personal score sheet and evaluation /coaching session. We just need YOU there to participate! PLEASE get your quartets registered and dues paid up, your choruses entered and all competitors paid up, and have convention registrations for all competitors.

\*\*IMPORTANT NOTE: Any mixed quartets, mixed choruses, female quartets, or female choruses will be welcome to perform for score and evaluation/coaching only. International prelims for these choruses will be open in Dixie beginning in fall 2020, and quartets beginning in spring 2010 for the BHS international convention in Cleveland, Ohio, in July 2021.

The Evaluations/Coaching sessions following the Quartet Semifinals, Chorus Finals and the Quartet Finals on Saturday will be different beginning this fall contest. The SCJC had produced a new EX-CEL Evaluation/Coaching Program for ALL districts to begin using this fall. The Contest Administrators and the Judging Panel will make the final decisions on whom and when you will be evaluated/coached. Once you have entered the contest, you will be sent a form to fill out of your choices for coaching/evaluation. These forms will be turned into the Contest Administrators. Your choices will be considered. Decisions will be based on PANEL CHOICES, rank, and, numbers of choices requested. I will not be a part of that decision any longer. I will still be able to help with dual memberships in choruses and to prepare the Order of Appearance. Beyond that, the Panel will in charge of evaluation/coaching.

Here are the judges who are on the Official Panel: MUS- Rick Spencer (DIX) & Patrick McAlexander (DIX); PER-Pat Brown (ONT) & Gary Steinkamp (FWD); SNG-Alan Gordon (FWD) & DC Nash (DIX).

Again, if you have ANY questions, need any help, or just want to chat, please feel free to call me ANY time. I am available to help you if needed. But remember; only qualified representatives so noted by Barberscore can OFFICIALLY enter your chorus or quartet. I cannot do it for you as Barberscore/SCJC rules forbid it.

How did the **Stone Mountain Chorus** get invited by the Atlanta Canadian Consulate to sing O Canada in the atrium of City Hall for the Consulate's official Canada Day celebration? It's a story that begins with the chorus' mission, to share our joy of singing with the local community.

Last year, the chorus took part in the first annual Johns Creek International Festival, performing for the crowd and staffing a booth for the day. There amongst the face painters, jewelry makers and candle vendors was the **Stone Mountain Chorus**, selling nothing but the joy of four part harmony. Guys from the chorus sang in small groups to entertain festival goers and to sing tags with anyone willing to give it a try. As we wandered around the Festival grounds, we noticed the Canadian Consulate had a booth there as well. Having learned an arrangement of *O Canada* to sing at Atlanta Gladiators hockey games, we asked them if they would like to hear it. They did, and loved it! They kept our contact information, and called on us to perform at their official Canada Day observance.

It was a great event, and we are proud to have done our small part to enhance international relations with our northern neighbor. #### "2019 Real Men Sing"

The **Big Chicken Chorus** will present its annual "**Real Men Sing**" at the **Marietta Performing Arts Center**, 1171 Whitlock Avenue in Marietta on the campus of Marietta High School on
Saturday, September 14th beginning at 1 PM.

The "Real Men Sing" program is a gateway to generating an interest in vocal music for young men in grades 6 through 12. This program has been executed with great success and praise from area music educators. The Big Chicken Chorus, along with the support of area music educators, Barbershop Harmony Society (BHS) clinicians, and BHS teaching quartets, has executed a one day choral music festival for young men since 2014, which provides the impetus for them to recognize the enjoyment music can bring. To date we have served 750 area students with this program.

This event is intended for all-comers; no audition or selection process is involved, and current involvement in a school choir is not a requirement. Two choruses are formed: one for young men in middle school and a second for young men in high school. The music involved is taken from age-appropriate standard choral repertoire and will include music arranged in the 4-part a cappella harmony style as sung by Barbershop Quartets, to be sung along with the Big Chicken Chorus and the Teaching Quartets.

The education, music scores, a free dinner and a custom designed T-shirt are provided to the participants in return for a registration fee of \$5 per participant. **No student will be excluded for financial reasons.** 

The day will conclude with a **FREE concert**, open to the public, which will include the **Middle School Chorus**, the **High School Chorus**, the **Big Chicken Chorus**, **Quadraphonics** and **Wildfire**. In 2019 we expect to attract more than 200 young men plus music educators from local middle and high schools. Our intention is to keep their focus on the joy of singing.

Sponsors of this years' event include: KFC – Big Chicken location; Northwest Atlanta Marriott; Marietta Kiwanis Art Fund; Marietta Performing Arts Center and the Big Chicken Chorus.

Terry Morrison, president of the Marietta Chapter of the Barbershop Harmony Society says, "The Big Chicken Chorus is a multi-generational, male chorus of more than 50 voices, singing a cappella, four-part harmony, in the style of a Barbershop Quartet. Our annual Real Men Sing Performance provides an opportunity for the young men in our community to experience the thrill of performing a cappella harmony as part of a large male ensemble. The clinic and performance illustrate the value to be gained by participating in choral music programs provided at area schools."

High School Clinician: Jimmy Tompkins holds a Bachelor's degree from Jacksonville State University in AL. He has had a long career as a Music Minister, presently at Morris Hill Baptist Church in Chattanooga, TN

Jimmy is a 20 plus year member of the Barbershop Harmony Society and has a wealth of performing and directing experience. He is currently a member of the Metro Atlanta

Chapter of BHS. In January 2019 Jimmy directed the Dixie District Senior Barbershop Chorus to an International Championship held on the stage of the Grand Ole Opry in Nashville, TN.



Middle School Clinician: Vincent Sandroni began his musical career with 15 years in The Maryland State Boychoir, serving as a chorister, soloist, and conducting intern. He received his Bachelor of Science in Music Education degree from Towson University. Vince has been the chorus teacher at Cockeysville Middle School in Baltimore County, Maryland for the past five years. He started singing barbershop in high school and has since participated in numerous conventions, harmony brigades,

No Borders Youth Consort, and Parkside Harmony.

Vince is the Tenor of **Pratt Street Power** the **2017 International Collegiate Barbershop Quartet Champions. Pratt Street Power** has continued to compete and is currently among the 2019 Top 10 International Barbershop Quartets.

**High School Teaching Quartet: Wildfire**, whose members hail from Nashville, TN and Tampa, FL. The members of the quartet come from different musical backgrounds and expertise after singing with numerous other quartets through their early years in the Barbershop Harmony Society.

In July 2019, Wildfire represented the Dixie District in Salt Lake City, UT at the International Next Generation Varsity Quartet Contest and won the contest; they are the 2019 International Next Generation Varsity Quartet Champions.



**Middle School Teaching Quartet: Quadraphonics**, a quartet of members of the Big Chicken Chorus, will assist Vincent Sandroni and the Middle School Chorus in the polishing of their songs. Although the quartet is relatively new, each of its members has many years of experience in singing.
