# Sentimental Gentlemen star as the SEC Smack-Talking Barbershop Quartet on Shorts

The **SEC Shorts** video featuring *Voices of the South*'s own **Sentimental Gentlemen** has nearly gone viral on **You-tube** and **Facebook** with more than 750,000 likes and hits.

SEC Shorts "ended its off-season on a high note with this quartet's debut on the college-football-comedy channel that has averaged more than 8 million views per season," according to the SEC Shorts website.

Sentimental Gentlemen — **Keith Lowry**, Lead; **Ed Wharton**, Bass; **John Holladay**, Baritone; and **Steve Callahan**, Tenor — performed parodies of some of *Voices*' repertoire. The songs were altered to fit the format of SEC Shorts.

"Remember us when you guys become the next internet sensation," **Matt Powell**, *Voices* director, said.

Josh Snead, SEC Shorts coproducer, reached out to Callahan in Instant Messenger. "I'm looking for a Barbershop Quartet," he said. "Are you guys able to do this?" The other producer is Robert Clay.

"We made it work," Callahan said. "It only took us about two weeks. We filmed it in the Avondale community of Birmingham,



Ala. SEC Shorts bought everything we had to have including our costumes. It only took us about two hours to do everything we had to do to make *The SEC Smack-Talking Barbershop Quartet* segment become a reality.

"The hardest part about the filming was that we had to stand there and put this bland look on our faces," Callahan added. "That was really hard because we practice and practice being totally animated when we sing."

SEC Shorts is an online comedy series exploring the crazy world of college football in the South. The series was created by Clay and Snead in 2014. SEC Shorts has been featured on the *Paul Finebaum Show*, *SEC Nation*, *Saturday Down South*, and many other reputable places.

"Snead met with us at **Saint Mark United Methodist Church** July 6 to start the whole process," Wharton said. "We went through some of the songs we knew from our chorus repertoire. Josh (Snead) just needed to hear them. He and his crew came back in a couple of days with some freshly penned parody lyrics. They pitched one song that they had composed the melody for, *Greetings from Alabama*. I arranged their score into four-part harmony.

The 3-minute, 12-second episode featured six segments:

• The 12 Days of Christmas highlighting the **Texas A&M** Aggies' epic seven-overtime victory over **LSU** last season.

Alabama always beating Tennessee.

Vanderbilt beating Missouri (but probably nobody else).

• Mississippi State ensuring Ole Miss didn't get a sixth win and consequently no bowl game.


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#### The Georgia/Florida recruiting smack.

And, nobody beats **Kentucky** 32 years in a row.

"It was a paid gig and we got paid a fair price," Callahan said. "We got bashed a couple of times in the comments section on Facebook. But most of the more than 700 comments were very good."

"The whole process took less than four-to-five weeks," he added. "We had about two weeks to learn the lyrics. The biggest delay was when all of the cars on the street in Avondale went rushing by. Even



with that, most of the time we were able to do most of the songs in one or two takes."

"It took about two hours to shoot all of our segments on July 28," Wharton said. "The SEC Shorts crew had recorded the other parts of the video even before we were brought in. The crew spent the rest of that Sunday editing the whole bit. The final product was posted early in the morning, July 29." Holladay said, "This was just a lot of fun to do. I'm an Alabama fan. Any time I can get a dig in at Tennessee, that's a good time. The guys from SEC Shorts were great. They were

flexible, but they had a clear plan for what they wanted."

"I loved the *Twelve Days of Christmas* rewrite about the LSU vs. Texas A&M game." Holladay added, "I also loved the line directed at Florida to the tune of *Can You Feel the Love Tonight?* that goes "Those 10-win days are gone like Spurrier."

Lowry added a great ending to the story. "It was a really fun experience to have been a part of! I've heard from people all over the Southeast about it. Friends have contacted me that I went to college and high school with, even back in the '70s. What a trip!"

Callahan said, "Hey, you know what? We're optimistic that we will get the opportunity to continue to work with SEC Shorts. There may be another gig in our future."
