

Atlanta Vocal Project and Big Chicken Chorus

Preserving harmony for the next generation



The Atlanta Vocal Project and the Big Chicken Chorus performed in a concert with and for the choral students of three elementary schools and Cooper Middle School in Powder Springs, Georgia. Lars Grevstad, who is an assistant director of the AVP, and director of the Big Chicken, and who is also the choral director at Cooper Middle School, organized the event. Over 275 enthusiastic students and a standing room only audience of over 600 enthralled adults were introduced to barbershop music. The finale was a Lars arrangement of "The Lion Sleeps Tonight" with all 325 singers participating. It was described by the school principal as "It was the best student concert that I have ever attended. If you weren't able to attend, you missed our student's creative choreography and Lars' running man and flips on the stage."



"Harmony Express" entertained the students for about a half hour with a diverse mixture of genres explaining to the audience just how many types of music can be sung. The enthusiasm from the students was incredible and one of the noticeable things was how the excitement grew as the songs entered into the tag.

Next up is for the chapter to provide a quartet or VLQ to sing the National Anthem at some up coming sporting events. The chapter enjoys promoting our hobby to the public but especially to the younger generation.
