More than 25 quartets will sing on Friday night, with a dozen of the finest choruses in the society taking the stage on Saturday. The quartets are seeking the Dixie District championship. Senior quartets are looking for a spot in the midwinter international contest. And the choruses are hoping for scores that will gain them entry into the 2014 international chorus contest in Las Vegas.

Cartersville Community Service Day

Although the Marietta Chapter, Big Chicken Chorus is located in Marietta, Georgia, members of the chorus represent communities throughout the metropolitan Atlanta area. One of those communities is Cartersville, a 35 to 40 minute drive to Marietta. Currently, five active members from Cartersville participate in chorus activities and are ambassadors for the chorus in their own community. The chorus has performed at the city's Grand Theater and a number of small groups including quartets and VLQs comprised of chorus members have performed in the community.

Cartersville members recently organized a Cartersville Community Service Day in September. Bill Devine, the chorus Vice President for Program and Cartersville resident, contacted a number of

assisted living, nursing home, and other care sites in the Cartersville community and arranged for a contingent from the Big Chicken Chorus to entertain residents of the eight facilities, primarily assisted living and nursing homes. The last site visited was the Advocates for Children's Flowering Branch Children's Shelter. The chorus will perform a Christmas Show in Cartersville that will benefit the Advocates for Children on December 8 at the Sam Jones Memorial United Methodist Church. The nonprofit facility serves over 2600 youth and provides services that assist in the awareness, prevention, and treatment of child abuse. The facility depends on

fund raising events to provide financial support for the facility and services they provide. The day's activities and the upcoming Christmas show in Cartersville were promoted by Mac McKenzie, another Cartersville member, on the Cartersville radio station, WBHF radio /1450.

Twenty two members of the chorus answered the call for volunteers to participate in this activity, resulting in what Drayton Justus, who directed the group, called a VVLQ (Very, Very Large Quartet). The group sang a selection of music that included pole cats and songs from the current chorus repertoire. The event garnered front page coverage in the Bartow County Daily Tribune News. For chorus members participating, it was most rewarding to see the smiles on residents' faces and to see their enjoyment. The day ended with an Afterglow at the City Cellar in downtown Cartersville. The group entertained restaurant patrons by singing several of our favorite pole cats.
