The Stone Mountain Chorus performed at Lawrenceville Road UMC in Tucker, GA on April 21 in support of the Men's Club "Music for Missions" concert series. The chorus performed here several years ago when we rehearsed at this church.

The church opens their doors on a regular basis for this concert series and only collects an offering to help their mission work. Next up for the Nashville Chapter is a performance at the opening of the new multimillion dollar Nashville Convention Center on May 19.







