A Month of Harmony for Choo Choo Chorus

Nashville Chapter Preps for International Contest

It is crunch time for Nashville's **Music City Chorus** as they prepare to represent the Dixie District at the International Chorus Contest in Pittsburgh.

The Dixie District has not had a representative earn a chorus medal since the **Big Chicken Chorus** placed third in 1999. Of course, the other 27 choruses headed to Pittsburgh are also hoping to bring home a medal for their own district.

In addition to the weekly Tuesday night rehearsals, the Music City Chorus held a three-day retreat at Paris Landing State Park. Hours were spent in rehearsal sessions with coaches Kevin Keller and David McEachern. While great progress on the contest set has been made, the chorus will continue to polish their set prior to leaving for Pittsburgh at the end of June.

The Nashville Chapter will also be represented in the quartet contest. **MC4** is a chapter quartet, and **RedZone** and **'Round Midnight** include Nashville chapter members among their quartet makeup.



One of the after-hours activities at the chorus retreat was a quartet tag contest. Nearly 20 quartets were formed, with Rich Smith, Robert Strong, Bill Munn, and Sam Wey taking top honors this year.


