

It is with heavy heart that the **Stone Mountain Chorus of the Greater Atlanta Chapter** (formerly the Stone Mountain Chapter) wishes to inform the district of the passing of several long-time members and supporters in the Atlanta barbershop community. Please see the following obituary notices as they were published.

Tim Fenton was a member of the Stone Mountain Chorus in the 90s and early 2000s, and traveled with the chorus on several cruises. Tim moved to Florida many years ago, and continued his barbershop membership with the Lemon Bay Barbershop Chorus

Owen "OK" Sterner was a member of the Atlanta Peachtree chapter and chorus in the 70s and 80s, and was a supporter for all Atlanta chapters and the Dixie District after his singing time ended. Many may recall that OK made a lot of the wooden plaques used by the District for many years. He also made special pieces for barbershop honors and other supporters.

Larry Crabb was a charter member for the Greater Atlanta Chapter, our first President, and (later) directed the chorus, both as front-line director and assistant director. Larry had over 50 "men of note" to his name throughout the Society. Larry lead the barbershop chorus at his Piano Technicians convention annually.

Don "DK" Kayler was a long-time Stone Mountain Chorus member that hosted many parties and gatherings for the chorus and neighbors. DK was the comedy backbone for the chorus for many years. DK had one of the best jobs that sent him to Florida for spring break. He would always return saying, "Hey, somebody had to do market research."

Jack Frobose (often referred to as "Circles") was another long-time member of the Stone Mountain Chorus. Jack become Chapter President and continued to eventually serve as Dixie District President in the 90s. Jack and Helenanne Frobose moved to Florida after retirement to enjoy life in the sun.

Larry was the first initiated member and President of the Iota Pi Zeta chapter of Lambda Chi Alpha at Texas Christian University. To this day, the chapter shows their appreciation for Larry, as members learn about his contributions to the fraternity on their first day of associate

membership. Every TCU Lambda Chi knows that Larry Crabb was the first initiated member of the Iota Pi Zeta chapter. When Larry would visit his alma mater, it is rumored that active members would rush to the fraternity house windows, hoping to catch a glimpse of the legend. Also, Larry was helpful in raising funds for the chapter, signing Lambda Chi flags for the annual Mother's Lambda Chi auction. He earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Commerce at TCU, followed by a Masters in Business Administration from the University of Michigan. With his sons, he operated LB Crabb Piano Service and enjoyed mentoring and sharing knowledge with his students. He was a Hall of Fame outstanding member of the Piano Technicians Guild and was recently honored with their most prestigious Golden Hammer award. His love for singing and socializing was evident as he shined for many years as a member of the Stone Mountain and Peachtree choruses and he brought 50+ men together into barbershop harmony. Larry was a devoted husband to his loving wife of 59 years, Evelyn Ruth Crabb, loving father to his sons Gregory Allen Crabb and Gary Lyndon Crabb (deceased 11/13/12) and caring grandfather to Rachel Marie and Kristen Michelle Crabb of Jefferson, GA. He was part of many organizations including Knights of Columbus, Men's Club, Chamber of Commerce, and The Marine Leatherneck Association.
