

Get Ready for a Hot Time in Huntsville

The Dixie District Spring Convention will return to the beautiful Von Braun Center in Huntsville, Alabama on March 17, 18 and 19.

Scheduled events include the International Quartet Preliminaries, Dixie Chorus Championship, Youth Quartet Contest, House of Delegates, and a Mixed Harmony Quartet Contest.

Individual registrations are \$57 and a family registration (up to four people) is \$120.50. Please remember that all contestants must purchase a convention registration.

Individual Contest Session Tickets will be available on-site: Quartet Semifinals and Chorus Contest - \$20.00, and Quartet Finals - \$25.00.

The Headquarters Hotel will be the Embassy Suites. Phone reservations can be made at 256-327-7838. The hotel rate is \$105 plus tax. Use the rate code DID. There is also a link for online registration on the Dixie District website.

Dusty is incredibly accomplished in the barbershop world: in addition to serving as the Director of Meetings & Conventions for BHS he has directed Nashville to a 5th place bronze medal, finished in the top 10 at International in a quartet, and is a certified Performance judge.

The JB chorus will have short rehearsals Friday afternoon and Saturday morning. Even those who aren't able to make it Friday afternoon are more than welcome to sing Saturday morning. Let's open the chorus contest with a bang for the judges and our audience!
